Bible-based fun!

Camp Elohim is located at the edge of the beautiful Cabinet Mountain wilderness. A well-trained volunteer staff serves here because we love Christ and the children. The Bible and Campers are our focus and joy.

In addition to chapel and Bible lessons, campers will enjoy many age-appropriate activities such as swimming, archery, rafting, canoeing, rifle safety & marksmanship, crafts, and campfire. All activities are fully supervised.

What do I need to bring?

Campers need to bring a warm sleeping bag, pillow, flashlight, water bottle, water shoes, and shoes for daily use (other than flip-flops). Clothes should include warm sleepwear, jeans, sweatshirts, rain gear, and a coat. Dress conservatively: **NO two-piece swimsuits** (or you must wear a t-shirt over top), no spaghetti string tank tops (cover the shoulders and midriff), **shorts must be below fingertips when arms are fully extended at the side**. Any clothing with words or graphics deemed inappropriate is subject to censorship. Don't forget prescribed medications (bee sting kit, allergy meds etc.) **Please label items with a last name for lost and found purposes.**

Necessary toiletries may include bath & beach towel, washcloth, soap, toothbrush and paste, hairbrush, shampoo, lip balm, sunscreen, insect repellent.

You will also need a notebook, pen or pencil, and your **Bible**.

What time do I come and go?

Arrival time-10:00 am Monday morning Departure time-11:00-11:30am Friday morning No Parents night on Thursdays!!

Don't forget we are in Mountain Time Zone!

How much does it cost?

Registration fees of \$150 are due in full by the registration deadline. These fees cover the entire week of housing, meals, and activities. (There are a limited number of scholarships available, please call (406)295-1115 to have one mailed to you. Please allow 2 weeks for processing so plan accordingly when registering.)

Camp Elohim has a store that sells pop, candy, ice cream, hats, t-shirts, and sweatshirts. Campers must let the store personnel keep their spending money on account for them (\$20-\$35 is sufficient), any unspent money is returned to the camper before he/she departs camp. Parents are welcome to pre-pay for t-shirts, sweatshirts, and for their child's snacks.

Which camp should I attend?

The camp experience is designed to be age appropriate for the grade the camper is *entering.* For example, if you will be entering 8th grade in the fall, you attend the 8th-9th grade week. High school camp is only for those entering 10th through 12th grades.

What do I need to leave at home?

Do not bring magazines, books, cell phones, electronic devices, alcohol, tobacco products, illegal drugs, fireworks, firearms, and knives. No food or drinks other than water will be allowed in the cabins.

- Registration and Medical forms completed online or mailed in as early as possible. Please label each campers' items with last name so that they can be returned easily.
- □ Spending money for camper included with this registration. This is optional. Funds will be deposited on account at the camp store for your camper's use. Any unused funds will be returned at the close of camp stay.
- □ If transportation arrangements change, please inform the camp director prior to pick up. Call the camp at (406) 295-1115.
- □ The camp keeps lost and found items only for 4 weeks. After that, we donate useable items to charities.
- Refunds will be given only if notified 7 days prior to the start of camp or in emergency situations by notifying the Camp Director.
 No refund will be made once the camp starts.
 We cannot prorate fees for attending only a part of the camp week.

Campers who are sick or become sick at camp will need to go home to protect our staff and other campers. Parents/guardians will be notified, and they will be responsible for transportation home.
